ELIGIBILITY The **Kids Helping Kids Awards** is open to Australian primary and secondary schools only. A teacher, principal or school employee must enter on behalf of the fundraising project group by the registration closing date. Please note late entries will be accepted past the registration date. All entries must be from a recognised Australian Primary or Secondary school. More than one fundraising project group per school may enter the Awards. Please note that more than one school cannot merge their fundraising projects and enter the Awards as a group or team. Entrants can only register their fundraising project in one category. Entry into multiple categories by one fundraising project will not be accepted.

If supporting a local fundraising project, it must fulfil the following criteria:

- Helping kids (under 18 years old)
 - Focusing on improving kids' educational opportunities
 - Helping children who are underprivileged or under resourced
- OR
- Helping kids who have been affected by a disaster or emergency

REGISTRATION AND SUBMISSIONS

All registered entrants must submit the required details of their fundraising projects by 15 September 2010, and all fundraising activities associated with the entry must have taken place in 2010 and not before. Entrants must submit their registration form, their submission form, and any supporting documents, by email or post, details and registration form available at www.schoolaid.org.au. Only completed registration and submission forms can be entered into the Awards judging process. Ongoing email support will be provided over the Awards period. SchoolAid accepts no responsibility for lost, late or misdirected entries. All entries and corresponding submissions outlining fundraising projects become the property of SchoolAid Trust. SchoolAid reserves the right to use the content of all submissions on YouTube, our website and in future publicity in order to increase SchoolAid's profile and participation. These videos may be made public so please ensure release forms are completed. Visit the **Kids Helping Kids Awards** website for more details. Material submitted will not be returned. Entrants must be available to participate in a publicity event at their school during November/December 2010 (date to be negotiated).

ENTRY

The Awards Terms and Conditions form part of this conditions of entry. Entry in the Awards constitutes full acceptance of these Terms and Conditions. All entrants agree to participate in publicity surrounding the awards and prizes if necessary (including TV, radio, electronic and print media). By entering into the Awards, winning schools consent to their name being published.

The Awards Judging Panel's decision is final.
