## ELIGIBILITY

The Kids Helping Kids Awards is open to Australian primary and secondary schools only. A teacher, principal or school employee must enter on behalf of the fundraising project group by the registration closing date. Please note late entries will be accepted past the closing date, on arrangement. All entries must be from a recognised Australian Primary or Secondary school. More than one fundraising project group per school may enter the Awards. Please note that more than one school cannot merge their fundraising projects and enter the Awards as a group or team. Entrants can only register their fundraising project in one category. Entry into multiple categories by one fundraising project will not be accepted.

If supporting your own chosen fundraising project, it must fulfil the following criteria:

### Helping kids (under 18 years old)

- Funnelling fundraising back into your local community and / or school to support kids in need and provide resources / facilities
- Focusing on improving kids' educational opportunities
- Helping children who are underprivileged or under-resourced
- Helping kids who have been affected by a disaster or emergency

## ENTRIES

All registered entrants must submit the required details of their fundraising activity by returning a completed entry form by 30 September 2011, and all fundraising activities associated with the entry must have taken place not earlier than September 2010. Entrants must submit their entry form and any supporting documents, by email or post, details available at [www.schoolaid.org.au](http://www.schoolaid.org.au).

Only entry forms can be entered into the Awards judging process. Ongoing email support will be provided over the Awards period. SchoolAid accepts no responsibility for lost, late or misdirected entries. All entries outlining fundraising projects become the property of SchoolAid Trust. SchoolAid reserves the right to use the content of all submissions on YouTube, our website and in future publicity in order to increase SchoolAid's profile and participation (pending receipt of relevant release forms) These videos may be made public so please ensure release forms are completed. Entering schools must be available, should they be judged a category winner, to nominate representatives to participate in an event with Ambassadors (date and location to be confirmed) in 2011.

### JUDGING PROCESS

A shortlist of finalists will be determined by SchoolAid staff and the winners will be selected by the Awards Judges. Winners will be announced on 1 November 2010 and published on the SchoolAid website. All entries will be formally acknowledged with a Certificate of Appreciation for their outstanding fundraising achievements, and recognition on our website Awards 'Honour Roll'. The Awards Judging Panel's decision is final.
